## Honor those who Work

Tea-publicians COMMIT TO reforming Immigration by requiring all employers to register their employees who are in the country illegally as guest workers within 6 months. Employers will be required to obtain finger prints and a picture of their workers and send this information to a government funded company to receive a guest worker card. This requirement is reasonable since our troops in Iraq have been using an electronic system to rapidly digitize the fingerprints and pictures of suspected militants and that technology could easily be implemented in civil society by employers.

Presently illegal aliens will then automatically become legal guest workers and be required to establish an American Wealth Account (AWA) for themselves and an American Medical Account (AMA) for themselves and each of their dependents, all of which would be deposited in an FDIC bank. This approach to a comprehensive immigration allows those presently here illegally to sign up for the normal immigration process, i.e. get in line while working in America. More importantly, the cost of medical care and future retirement funds for guest workers are addressed through employer matching deposits in an AWA and AMAs. This approach prevents citizens from funding illegal immigrant's medical care and results in an equal wages for guest workers and citizen workers since the benefit costs are included in the cost each employer must fund when employing a guest worker. One further step in insuring that illegal immigrants do not burden the local communities for the expense of emergency medical care is to reimburse local medical expenses by placing a lien on the foreign aid of the illegal immigrant's originating country.

After 6 months, the illegal alien issue will be resolved, guest workers will be able to enter and leave the country as they find work with their guest worker card. Those illegal aliens that do not register with the government or with their employers will be deported, independent of their situation with their families. In addition, the present law that bestows citizenship on those born in this country to non-citizen parents will be revised to bestow citizenship only on those born to citizen parents.
